Lake George Jr.-Sr. High School Ranked in Top 6% in Nation

Lake George Junior-Senior High School has been named one of the top public high schools in the nation by *U.S. News and World Report*.

The monthly magazine, which is known for its grading of high schools, colleges, and universities, placed Lake George Junior-Senior High School in the top 6% of all high schools in the nation.

This follows the school's top grade regionally, as the No. 1 school in Warren and Washington Counties and 178th out of 1,165 high schools in New York State (*Buffalo First Business Journal*) and No. 10 school in the Capital Region and the North Country (*Capital District Business Review*).

With the new National Rank, No. 1,381 of 21,776 high

schools, the Lake George Junior-Senior High School was awarded the news magazine's Silver Medal.

The excellent grade is based on the college-readiness index, student-teacher ratio, and test scores. *U.S. News and World Report* indicates that 99 percent of Lake George graduates are proficient in both mathematics and English and that the school provides outstanding Advanced Placement opportunities for its students.

"Once again, we are all reminded that our faculty, staff, and programs are top-notch," said Superintendent of Schools Patrick Dee. "Lake George Jr.-Sr. High School is a stellar environment and it's wonderful to get this recognition on a national stage."

Elementary School Adapts to Changes in Standards

New York State has adopted the Common Core State Standards, increasing rigor K-12 and raising the bar to ensure that all students are career- and college-ready. To meet the challenges of the new standards, the Elementary School is making changes in how it delivers instruction. Principal James Conway shared these changes in the following letter.

In 1996, New York State approved K-12 learning standards for all students and 4th grade testing began. In 2005-2006, No Child Left Behind required us to test students in grades 3-8. Following this change LGES purchased grade-level reading and math programs, but maintained multi-age instruction in science and social studies. In 2008-2009, when I came on board as the elementary principal, we began discussing the need to map our curriculum and ensure that our curriculum was aligned to state standards. In 2010, we learned that New York adopted the new Common Core Standards. Over the past year and a half, our teachers have been working to ensure that our curriculum and assessment will be aligned with the Common Core Standards. Our students will be tested by the state on these standards next year.

The new core standards are grade-level-based but allow us to return to a system of teaching in thematic units. Thematic units connect the science, social studies, ELA, math, and "specials" that are taught at each grade-level around a particular theme. While this type of instruction requires a

great deal of planning, our teachers are up to this challenge. They have been working all spring on this shift and many will work throughout the summer to prepare for the upcoming school year.

As we began to map the ELA program this spring, it was apparent that we needed to make changes in our delivery model to meet the new standards. With changes in curriculum being grade specific, our ability to multi-age for science and social studies with a two-year program no longer exist. Those subjects are now directly connected with grade-level ELA (reading and writing).

Our Educational Cabinet and staff discussed at great length possible ways to deliver the new standards. We realized that to teach the new standards, we needed to shift from multi-age home bases and teams to graded home bases and teams in the 2012-2013 school year.

Kindergarten has utilized grade-level teaming effectively for a number of years. The concept is that three classroom teachers plus a special education teacher teach all of the students at the grade-level. They work together to meet the instructional needs of all students. This is the model that we will incorporate at all levels next year.

All children will be regrouped and assigned to a home base on a grade-level team. Their new home base will be indicated on their final progress report. The process of assigning students to a team will be completed by teachers and administrators to create balanced classes

in the same manner that we utilize for students entering kindergarten, moving into primary, and then last year, for those students who moved into new levels.

With grade-level teams, there will be a three home-base team on both sides of the cluster. At Intermediate I, for example, the third-grade team will be on the left half of the cluster and the fourth-grade team will be on the right half of the cluster.

While older and younger students will not be in home bases together, programs that we have embraced for years such as our reading buddies will allow multi-age opportunities to continue.

Our Educational Cabinet has discussed and will work to create a plan to involve students in meaningful multi-age activities such as through projects, celebrations, and character education experiences.

LGES teachers will continue to differentiate instruction to challenge our highest-achieving students and provide necessary support for our students that struggle.

Unlike a traditional school with one teacher trying to do that for all students in their class, our teaching teams will work together in our open classroom model to allow that to happen.

We will continue to utilize our WIN time and our extensive enrichment opportunities to meet our mission of meeting the needs of all students.
