Lake George Jr.-Sr. High School Ranked in Top 6% in Nation

Newsweek, the weekly online news magazine, has named the Lake George Central School District among the top 2,000 schools in the nation.

The magazine determined the ranking of 1,300 out of 2,000 based on its effectiveness in turning out college-ready graduates. The list is based on six criteria: graduation rate (25 percent), college acceptance rate (25 percent), advanced placement tests taken per student (25 percent), average SAT/ACT scores (10 percent), average advanced placement scores (10 percent), and percent of students enrolled in at least one advanced placement course (5 percent).

Lake George was the only Warren County school to be included in the rankings.

“Once again, the Lake George School District stands out as one of the area’s best,” said Superintendent of Schools Patrick

Dee. “It proves what an outstanding job our faculty and staff do in educating our children. I couldn’t be prouder.”

In addition to the *Newsweek*’s recognition, the Lake George High School was honored by the State Department of Education as a New York State Reward School. Furthermore, both the *Buffalo Business First* and the Capital Region’s *Business Review* have named Lake George as a top state and regional school, respectively.

“We are pleased with all the acknowledgement of our efforts to continually improve our school,” added Mr. Dee. “We strive to refine our methods and our school culture, so that students can achieve optimum learning in a safe and supportive setting.”

Sixth Graders to Gain 21st Century Skills from 1:1 Computer Access in Fall

Next fall, the sixth grade students will enter the world of 1:1 computing through the Classroom 21 Program.

Essentially, this means that every child will have access to his or her own computer.

The move is meant to not only help the students hone their technological skills, but enhance their ability to delve into self-directed or project and inquiry-based learning.

“Having computers in the classroom is a tremendous resource,” said Megan Coker, the district’s technology coordinator. “It will help the children learn how to find out information that they need and how to use the facts for a greater understanding.”

It works like this: rather than a teacher standing in front of the classroom, lecturing to relay information to the students, the teacher will pose “an essential question.” Mrs. Coker gave an example: “how do shapes play a role in nature.”

The students will then have to discover the answer, first, by researching what shapes exist in nature. From there, they will explore how these shapes help flora and fauna thrive and survive. The end product for all students is a wider knowledge of the subject as well as a cultivation of highly valued 21st century skills like critical thinking, problem-solving, in-group projects, collaboration and communication.

Often, these essential questions are answered by students who

work in groups using *Google Docs*. This application helps to ensure that every student is contributing to the project, as Google Docs tracks each user’s input.

“Students will no longer be able to sit back and try to fly under the radar,” said Mrs. Coker who is a former sixth grade teacher.

Students will then present their findings in a variety of ways including blogs, video slideshows, and websites.

The move to a computer for every child is an extension of the high school’s 21st century classroom. Five high school classrooms do have computers on which students do research and complete projects, often in groups.

The desks, like the computers, are portable, so the students mix and mingle simply by pushing their wheeled desks together.

She added that Classroom 21 projects can be large or small – lasting a day or several weeks. Finally, the computers fulfill the Common Core Curriculum requirement of integrating technology into every subject.

“We are very excited about bringing this to the elementary school,” said Mrs. Coker. “It does require more upfront prep time for the teachers, coming up with the essential question, establishing what the students need to know and finding resources. It will be worth it because the students will be more engaged.”
