

Jazz Ensemble - Meets before school on Friday mornings at 7:15. All members of junior and senior band are eligible to join. If you are not in band, membership will be determined by audition. All members of Jazz Ensemble must be able to read music. Jazz ensemble performs in regular school concerts, on the Dollars For Scholars Annual Cruise and at various command performances throughout the year. Junior High Arts Club - The Junior High Arts Club is open to all 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students who are interested in creating arts and crafts. For many of the projects, we will be using mediums and techniques that are not used in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade art classes. Each month, a different theme will be selected, for example, candle-making, acrylic rock painting, and hand-made journal-books will be anticipated themes that will be offered during 10<sup>th</sup> period every Monday. To become a member, students should attend the first meeting in the fall. Mrs. Barker, the Junior High Art teacher, is the advisor for the club.

**Anti-Bullying Committee** - A group of students committed to promoting a positive school climate.
