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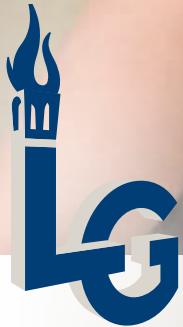

## Student Attendance

The Board of Education of the Lake George School District recognizes that student attendance in school is an important component of student success. Student interaction with teachers and other students in class helps to enhance the academic learning experience and provides a basis by which students can demonstrate mastery of subject matter.

### Rationale and Objectives of the Lake George School District's Comprehensive Attendance Policy

Every student has a right to educational opportunities that will enable the student to develop to their fullest potential. Numerous studies link attendance with student achievement, therefore increased student attendance will result in improved student achievement. An effective attendance policy is crucial to a good education. Attendance policies are based on the principle that regular school attendance maximizes the student's interaction with their teachers and peers, and is a major component of academic success. Improved school attendance procedures that provide for the early identification of attendance problems and effective methods to address them are most likely to succeed. ## Student Code of Conduct

### Discipline Philosophy:

It is the philosophy of the Lake George Central School District that discipline is more than responding to a student's misbehavior with rewards or punishments. It is a proactive process of developing responsible decision making of students creating a positive and safe learning environment and building positive relationships with students. Qualities of cooperation, self discipline, social responsibility, and mutual respect become the goals of discipline in a democratic society or classroom.

### Our goals in establishing a positive orderly school are to:

- Establish a climate of equality and mutual respect.

- Encourage students.
- Offer students a role in decision-making.
- Develop students' self-discipline by offering them consistent, logical, fully understandable guidelines for behavior.

## Visitor Sign-In

Any visitor to a school building within the Lake George Central School District must sign in with the greeter of that building. Signs are posted on the main entrances of each building directing you to do so. You are to receive a visitor's badge and wear the badge while on the premises. Visitors must comply with the directions of office personnel. Upon completion of your business, you must sign out and return your badge.

## School Medication Policy:

If a student is to take any prescription or over-the-counter medication during school hours, parents/guardians must bring in the medication in the original bottle with both a signed parental consent form and a written order from a physician or other licensed health care provider giving the School Nurses' permission to administer the medication. The medication order

must include: the student's name, diagnosis, and the name of the medication, dosage, route, and time to be administered. All medication will be kept locked in the Health Office while on school property. Students are not allowed to keep medication of any kind in their personal property, including book bags, desks, lockers, clothing, etc. The only exception is for inhalers, which may be carried and self-administered by the student with parental consent, a specifically-written Doctor's order, and with the approval of the School Nurse.

### Information Regarding the Dispensing of Medication:

In order to comply with New York State Law, the following procedures must be followed for all students requiring medication during school hours:

A signed, written order from the physician to administer the medication must be provided to the Health Office

Signed, written parental/guardian consent to administer the medication must be on file in the Health Office website

The medication must be brought to the Health Office by the parent/ guardian in the original labeled container including prescribed and over-the counter (OTC) medications.

Medications not in their original containers will not be accepted. These orders are for both prescribed and over-the-counter medications including Tylenol, Advil, cough/cold medicines, etc.



Students are NOT permitted to carry any medications (prescribed and/or OTCs) with them during school at any time. Exceptions in special circumstances are students requiring inhalers and/or emergency medications such as EpiPen.

A signed, written order from the 1) physician, 2) parent/guardian, and 3) provider for permission for self administration is required in these special cases. Permission to allow these students to carry their medication is at the discretion of the Health Office. If you have any questions, please contact your child's nurse.

## Bus Safety Rules and Procedures

The most important element of school bus transportation is the safety of students. In order to achieve a safe and efficient system, drivers must have the cooperation of all student riders.

1. Conduct on the school bus shall be of the same high standard as expected in the classroom. All school rules apply while students are on the bus. Students shall be courteous to fellow riders and their bus driver. Such acts as fighting, pushing, obscene talk or gestures will not be tolerated and will be cause for disciplinary action.
2. In order to maintain a strict time schedule, drivers cannot wait for students. Students must be ready and on time for boarding the bus each morning. PLEASE BE READY!
3. Students shall wait until the bus comes to a full stop before entering the roadway to board the bus or before leaving their seat to get off the bus.
4. Students should use extreme caution when getting on or off the bus. When crossing the highway, wait for the driver to signal to do so and cross 10 feet from the front of the bus.
5. Students shall always take a seat upon boarding a bus and remain seated at all times while the bus is in motion.
6. Students are to keep arms and heads inside of the bus at all times. Bus windows shall be kept shut unless permission to open them is given by the driver.
7. Drugs, Alcohol, Smoking, or the use of tobacco, or any illegal substances by students on the bus is strictly prohibited at all times. Eating of food, drinking of beverages, and taking medication is not permitted on the bus.
8. Electronic devices, glass items, knives and other dangerous objects are prohibited on the bus. Also, bulky items, pets, and animals should not be brought on the bus unless with permission granted ahead of time.
9. Buses must be kept clean at all times. Each student has the duty and responsibility to see that they do not litter.
10. Students shall remain on the bus until it arrives at school or at home. Drivers will not let students off upon request unless a pass is obtained from the Attendance Office for a change in riding status and given to the driver. A written parental request is required for any change from one bus to another or for a change in pick-up or drop-off point. Allowing for sufficient time to effect these changes ensures student safety.
11. The school bus driver is completely in charge when transporting students. All instructions given shall be followed and students should cooperate with the driver in any way they can.

These rules are made for the safety and benefit of all students. Unfortunately, there may be students who will not or do not abide by the rules. In the event of violations, the following disciplinary steps have been established:

- Verbal warning by the Bus Driver.
- Written referral to the Principal for possible disciplinary action or suspension, with parental notification.
- Parent conference with school administrator in order to determine eligibility for continued transportation.
- School authorities may remove a student from bus privileges at any time if the offense is serious enough to warrant such action, regardless of the number of violations.

- Exclusive of the verbal warnings, parents will be notified of bus incidences and violations.

To assure bus safety, the New York State Education Department requires three school bus drills during each school year.

## Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

Pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, Lake George Central School District hereby notifies parents and guardians that they have the right to:

- Inspect and review a student's educational record
- Seek correction of parts of a student's education record which they believe to be inaccurate, misleading or in violation of the student's rights. These rights include the right to a hearing to present evidence that the record should be changed if the district decides not to alter it according to the parent's or an eligible student's request
- Report or file a complaint with the Department of Education if the school district violates FERPA
- Exercise a limited control over the student's education records, in a hearing if necessary
- Be informed about FERPA rights

You are further advised: The school district shall limit the disclosure of information contained in the student's education records except:

- a. by prior written consent of the student's parents or an eligible student,
- b. directory information or
- c. under certain circumstances, as permitted by FERPA, state and federal law.

All rights and protections given to parents under FERPA and this policy transfer to the student when the student reaches 18 or enrolls in a post-secondary school.

## Student Privacy

Under the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA), parents have the right to inspect and opt their child out of any student survey that reveals information about personal attitudes, behaviors or beliefs. Parents also have the right to receive notice of and opt their child out of any activities that involve the collection, disclosure or use of a student's personal information for marketing purposes and out of any non-emergency, invasive physical exam or screening, except for hearing, vision and scoliosis screenings or as permitted or required by state law.

## Dignity for All Students Act

The Dignity for All Students Act (DASA) requires school districts to develop a policy that prohibits harassment, bullying, and discrimination and adds awareness to actual or perceived race, weight, national origin, ethnic group, religion, religious practice, disability, sex, sexual orientation, and gender. The goal of the DASA is to create a safe and supportive school climate where students can learn and focus in a welcoming considerate environment.

## Pesticide Notification – Your Right to Know

New York State Education Law Section 409-H, effective July 1, 2001, requires all public elementary and secondary schools to provide written notification to all persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff regarding the potential use of pesticides periodically throughout the school year. The Lake George Central School District is required to maintain a list of persons in parental relation, faculty, and staff who wish to receive 48-hour prior written notification of certain pesticide applications. If you wish to be placed on this list, please contact the Director of Facilities, Kevin Parrott at 518-668-5452, ext. 1219.

The following applications are not subject to prior notification requirements:

- A school remains unoccupied for a continuous 72 hours following an application
- Antimicrobial products
- Nonvolatile rodenticides in tamper resistant bait stations in areas inaccessible to children
- Silica gels and other non-volatile ready-to-use pastes, foams, and gels in areas inaccessible to children
- Boric acid and disodium octaborate tetrahydrate
- The application of EPA designated biopesticides
- The application of EPA designated exempt materials under 40CFR152.25

- The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in container of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps and hornets
- In the event of an emergency application necessary to protect against imminent threat to human health, a good faith effort will be made to supply written notification to those on the 48-hour prior notification list.

## ANNUAL NOTIFICATION

### Availability of the District Asbestos Management Plan

The Lake George Central School District has submitted information regarding asbestos containing building materials in the school district to the New York State Education Department. This information is documented in the school district's Asbestos Management Plan, which is in compliance with the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA) of 1987 (40 CFR Part 763). This memorandum is intended to fulfill the annual notification requirements. Under the AHERA Regulation the school district is required to perform re-inspections on all facilities which contain asbestos-containing construction materials once every three years. Documentation related to the re-inspection is available in the Asbestos Management Plan. The AHERA regulations further require that periodic surveillances of the same asbestos containing materials be performed twice a year. These inspections have been, and continue to be, performed and records of the surveillances are also with the Asbestos Management Plan. The Asbestos Management Plan for Lake George Central School is available to the public for review during the following time period. Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 3 p.m.
